




Employees have always been required to wash hands frequently, as well as after using the restroom. Kitchen staff are always required to wear gloves.





# Finding Their Voice

Special devices and apps help patients communicate

One of the hallmarks of Shriners Hospitals for Children is the staff's commitment to the overall well-being of our patients. For some patients with both orthopaedic and other conditions, as well as speech-related difficulties, that could mean something as significant as helping them learn to communicate.

Speech/language pathologist Laura Barnett leads the speech therapy program at our Salt Lake City location, which serves about 30 children at any given time, including several kids who participate in the augmentative communications program.

#### How the program works

Barnett's patients are children with speech disorders who also have a range of other conditions, including cerebral palsy, traumatic brain injury and genetic syndromes. The children who are non- or minimally verbal, or whose speech is very difficult to understand, are evaluated to determine whether the augmentative communications program would benefit them. The

assessment answers these questions:

- How well does the child understand language?
- What types of pictures or symbols do they understand?
- How can they access an augmentative communications system: pointing, eye gaze, using a switch?
- · How well can they see and hear?
- How will the device be carried on their body, walker or wheelchair?

Once the evaluation is complete, Barnett works with the families and the patients' school teams to develop the criteria needed for the communication system for each child, and then matches that information to available devices and apps. Once a suitable system is found, the request is either submitted for insurance funding, or a donated iPad and iTunes card (to purchase the

augmentative communication apps, such as picture displays) is sought. These apps can cost from \$200 to \$300. "Some patients get a specific device designed for augmentative communication; others do better with an iPad-app combination," said Barnett. "Medical insurance generally will not pay for an iPad, so we rely on donations."

#### The power of communication

Barnett uses an iPad in nearly all her therapy sessions. For the non-verbal children, it provides a way to communicate about the play activities that are part of therapy. Although the children learn to play the games on the devices quickly, it takes about a year to become proficient in using the communication app.

"For children who cannot speak, using an iPad to communicate opens up the world and allows the child to interact with their families and others," said Barnett. "Communication is really the essence of human life. Children who learn to use augmentative communication systems have the opportunity to express their own thoughts and ideas, ask for what they need and ask questions."

Lauren, 4, is one of Barnett's patients who is benefiting from this program. She is learning to use the Touch Chat app.

"Lauren is coming along quickly now," said her mother, Jessica. "We are grateful she got some help purchasing the app. It's helpful for her to be able to express herself in ways she was not able to before."

Several other Shriners Hospitals locations, including Erie, Pennsylvania; Tampa, Florida; Springfield, Massachusetts; Philadelphia and Chicago, also have speech therapy programs that incorporate the use of iPads.

## Masonic Digest / Scottish Rite

*The upcoming national election,* with its endless television commercials, prerecorded telephone calls, debates and campaign mailers evokes relief that Freemasonry proscribes the discussion of politics in open Lodge.

Nonetheless, as discussed in the January 2015 edition, our ancient brethren encouraged us to be informed citizens and to actively participate in our own governance. That missive noted two examples: Past Grand Masters Thomas Brown and Albert W. Gilchrist also served as Governors of Florida.

Several Scottish Rite degrees direct our attention to matters of governance and politics and to our proper role in the process.

The 4th, 5th, and 6th degrees can be interpreted as emphasizing the importance of an educated, enlightened citizenry. An independent judiciary is a theme in the 7th degree. An orderly economic system is highlighted in the 8th degree. The functions of Upper and Lower legislative bodies are hinted at in the 9th and 10th, as is freedom of the press; trial by jury appears in the 11th and the importance of the Chief Executive is alluded to in the 12th. The 13th degree includes an oration suggesting that a "mixed constitution" will foster the preservation of liberty." These degrees seem to frame our role in civic life and encourage our engagement. Whatever our level of interest in (or frustration with) politics might be, as men, Masons and citizens, we have a duty at least be an "educated, enlightened" citizen.

Marcus Cicero (106-43 BCE) a Roman philosopher and statesman, instructed his son on the realm of politics in a letter that became a classic book, *On Obligations*.

Recalling an analogy found in Book VI of Plato's *Republic* (beginning at line 488, if you're interested), Cicero suggests that political candidates and wannabe leaders are like a group of inexperienced sailors, each vying to seize the helm of a ship. Each man thinks that he ought to steer, though he has never performed the art. Unable to describe their terms of apprenticeship for sailing and navigation, their qualifications for leading, the sailors attack each other and endeavor to throw each other overboard. The process can result in a rudderless, aimless, drifting ship.

As for the qualified citizen seeking office, "canvassing and scrambling for office is an utterly wretched business."

Although Cicero describes a dismal process to his son. He urges his son not to withdraw, but to engage. As a citizen, he must not show bitter anger towards adversaries. Rebukes and disagreements must be free of insult. He should be noble, exemplary in conduct, conciliatory and forgiving. "Those who live in free societies where there is equality before the law should make a habit of affability and maintain a high level of tolerance."

Sounds Masonic, doesn't it? Moral conduct, subdued passions, openmindedness, tolerance, kindness, politeness.

As Masons maybe we can set a good example for our fellow citizens. Certainly, we can do better than the sailors.



# A YOUNG MAN'S PATH TO BROTHERHOOD

One Man's Perspective on Being a Shrine-Mason

★ Unlike so many who were led to Masonry by their fathers, 29-year-old Martiall Pitts' introduction was steeped in pure fiction. "To be completely honest," he said, "my first ideas about Masonry came from books like *The Da Vinci Code* or TV shows like *Bones*. I thought Masons were a myth or some sort of hoax — like the mole people."

At age 25, however, Pitts' desire for male camaraderie led him to seek a more reality-based understanding. He contacted a Mason through Instagram who was happy to answer questions. Pitts was receptive to what he learned. "I liked the idea of a group of guys that supported each other and had real friendships," he said.

Then one day, a sales call put Pitts in a businessman's office that had a display of Masonic and Shriner certificates. Pitts expressed curiosity, so Noble Darren Chruikshanks (now Assistant Rabban of Gizeh Shriners), spent a good 90 minutes telling the young man about both brotherhoods.

Learning about Shriners Hospitals for Children settled the matter. "When I found out that there was this awesome group of Masons who dedicate their time to helping kids, I knew I wanted to join the Shriners as soon as I could," Pitts said. In September of 2017, nine months after becoming a Mason, he became a member of Gizeh Shriners in Burnaby, British Columbia, Canada.

#### Making Connections at a Distance

Gizeh's jurisdiction encompasses the province of British Columbia and the Yukon Territory. Pitts' home in Fort St. John, British Columbia, is more than a 13-hour drive north of Gizeh Shriners' temple, so Pitts' interactions with fellow Shriners are primarily limited to his local club and another group south of his home. Despite the distances, the young Shriner has found the camaraderie and brotherly encouragement he was seeking.

Pitts puts the average age of nobles at his local club at 55 and estimates the average overall age of members of Gizeh is closer to 65, but he is not bothered by the age gap. "I'm the guy who socializes with everyone," he said. "I get something out of every interaction."

Pitts is eager to see more men join the Shriners fraternity and he believes that social media can help promote membership. "We have so many tools at our disposal now," he said. "We need to use them to change the perception around Shriners."



#### The Issue of Time

Although age isn't an issue for Pitts, he sees how being a Shriner may present men with young families challenges that are different from those faced by empty nesters and retirees.

Pitts, who drives in his club's Tin Lizzie Squad, believes that time demands on men in their 20s through 40s may be a concern as they consider a fraternal commitment. While many men in this age group admit being a Shrine–Mason "sounds great," they may not want to miss precious evenings at home with their families.

"At this time in our lives, many things split our attention," Pitts said. "It might even be worse for my generation — having to always be connected. I can't seem to get away from work."

Nevertheless, he is undaunted by the challenge and will continue to do his part to promote temple growth. "I take every opportunity to talk to any guy who will listen about Masonry and Shriners," he declared, adding, "I currently have three friends going through the steps to become Masons."


We have had a quiet month. We are starting a new year with hopes of it being successful.

- 4. How does it work and where does the money go? The tabs are delivered to the Sahib office (or almost any Sahib club/unit location) and then taken to the recycling center. The money netted from recycling goes directly into the "Wheel Chair Repair Fund" at the Tampa Shriners Hospital for Children.



#### AN EXCERPT FROM GENERAL ORDER NO. 1: FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES

It is natural to associate the fez with Shriners Hospitals for Children. Because of this, meticulous attention must be given to all fundraising activities, including circuses, to make certain that such activities comply with the law of the land and that a contributor is not led to believe that his money will be used for the Hospitals when all or a portion thereof will be used otherwise. The integrity of our charity and of our fraternity must remain above reproach.

Your specific attention is called to the following fraternal and charitable bylaws:

§335.3 USE OF NAME "SHRINERS HOSPITALS FOR CHILDREN." The use of the name "Shriners Hospitals for Children" or reference to the Hospitals in connection with any fundraising activity by a temple or Noble without the written consent of the Imperial Potentate and the Chairman of the Boards of Trustees of the Hospitals is prohibited.

§503.11 COMMERCIAL USE OF NAME

The use of the name "Shriners Hospitals for Children" or reference to the Hospitals in connection with any commercial product or business enterprise is prohibited unless the written consent of the Boards of Directors and Trustees has been first obtained.

Now, therefore, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED: 1.

- Fundraising for Fraternal Purposes:
  - No Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), club, unit, organization of Nobles or affiliated or appendant corporations shall engage in any fundraising activity without the express written consent of the potentate of the temple having jurisdiction thereof.
  - b. There can be no representation, express or implied, that the proceeds will be for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children.
  - The temple potentate shall carefully examine all phases of the C. advertising, promotion and solicitation to determine that it complies with §335.3 and §503.11 of the fraternal and charitable bylaws and that there is no representation, expressed or implied, that would lead a reasonably prudent person to believe that the proceeds will be for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children. If the potentate is in doubt, he must receive the opinion of the Imperial Potentate who, after consultation with the Director of Temple Accounting, shall make the final determination.
  - d. The temple potentate must approve the terms and provisions of any contract for a fundraising activity after receiving the advice of the temple attorney, and additionally, as may be required by the temple bylaws.
  - A copy of the temple potentate's written consent shall be e. mailed to the Executive Vice President, Shriners International. Further, such written material pertaining to the fundraising activity, as requested by the Executive Vice President, Shriners International shall be promptly mailed to him.
- 2 Fundraising for Charitable Purposes:
  - No Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), club, unit, organization of Nobles or affiliated or appendant corporations shall engage in any charitable fundraising activity other than for Shriners Hospitals for Children. Permission therefore must be first obtained in writing from the temple potentate. The temple potentate must then obtain written permission from the Chairmen of the Boards of Directors and Trustees. This request for written permission shall be sent to the Executive Vice President, Shriners International, P.O. Box 31356, Tampa, FL 33631-3356. No charitable fundraising activity shall be held in the jurisdiction of another temple without the written permission of the potentate of that temple.
    - A joint charitable fundraising activity with another i. 501(c)(3) charity may be authorized provided that a minimum of 50% of the net proceeds are for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children, and the Chairmen of the Board of Directors and Trustees determine, on a case by case basis, that it is in the best interest of Shriners Hospitals for Children and they grant their written permission for the activity.
    - ii. A charitable fundraising activity conducted by a temple located outside of the U.S.A. may be authorized for other charities, provided that the chairmen of the Board of Directors and Trustees determine, on a case by case basis, that it is in the best interest of Shriners Hospitals for Children and they grant their written permission for the activity.

- 100% of net proceeds (as defined in the Charitable Fundraising-b. Approval and Reporting provisions of the current General Order) from charitable fundraising must be given to Shriners Hospitals for Children except for such portion thereof as may be permitted to be retained for the temple Shrine Hospital Patient Transportation Fund, pursuant to the Special Purpose Funds provisions of the current General Order. Provided, however, if the chairmen of the Board of Directors and Trustees determine for good cause shown, that the law of the land requires that a portion of the net proceeds must be distributed locally, then they may, if they determine it to be in the best interest of Shriners Hospitals for Children, grant their written permission for such distribution.
- The temple shall report the result of each charitable fundraising c. activity within sixty days of the activity, pursuant to the Charitable Fundraising--Approval and Reporting provision of the current General Order.
- d. This section shall not apply to activities exempt under §335.4(b) of the bylaws of Shriners International.
- Each independent corporation or entity that receives the e. permission of the chairmen of the Boards of Directors and Trustees to raise moneys for Shriners Hospitals for Children, and which does not have its financial statements reviewed pursuant to §334.6 and §337.8 of the bylaws of Shriners International, shall have its financial statements audited by a certified, chartered or licensed public accountant and shall submit such audit report to Shriners International within 120 days of the activity.
- Statement of Purpose and Disclosure 3.
  - Every fundraising activity must contain factual information on its a. solicitation material, tickets, programs and documents, including all electronically transmitted materials, regarding the use of the proceeds. Examples:

"Proceeds are for the benefit of (\_ Shriners) Shrine Club) activities."

- "Proceeds are for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children." b. Every fundraising activity which is not entirely for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children shall prominently state on the solicitation material, tickets, programs, documents and electronically transmitted material that "payments are not deductible as charitable contributions."
- c. There must be compliance with the Revenue Act of 1987 provision of any existing general order by U.S. temples.
- Compliance with Applicable Laws: 4.

It is the responsibility of the temple potentate, after receiving the advice of the temple attorney, to determine that there is compliance with all applicable laws in its jurisdiction for the temple's fundraising activities. Financial Records:

- 5.
  - The temple shall maintain detailed financial records pertaining to a. all fundraising activities involving Nobles, clubs, units, organizations of Nobles and affiliated and appendant corporations. Details of all revenues and expenditures shall be maintained in such financial records.
  - b. The temple must retain such detailed financial records for a period of seven (7) years.
  - There must be compliance with Financial Reporting on Charitable C. Funds and Activities provision of the current general order.
- Notification to Nobility: 6.

A copy of the Fundraising Activities provisions of the current general order shall be printed in the temple publication at least once every calendar year. If there is no temple publication, then a copy shall be mailed to each Noble in the temple not later than the last day in March of each calendar year.

Discipline: 7

Any officer, Noble or temple which violates a provision of Fundraising Activities is subject to discipline pursuant to the bylaws of Shriners International.
